

5. BRANCH BC05 ADVOCACY POLICY

1. To advocate for measures beneficial to annuitants and potential annuitants of the Public Service of Canada, the Canadian Forces, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, the Federally appointed Judiciary and other Federal Agencies or bodies deemed appropriate by the Association's Board of Directors.
2. To oppose measures harmful to the Association and its members.
3. To promote the general welfare of the Association and its members.
4. To participate in local and provincial advocacy, dealing with issues of importance to the Association and seniors in our community.
5. To inform members and seniors of:
 - a) the policies and initiatives of the B.C. and federal governments.
 - b) the election platforms of all B.C. and national political parties, and
 - c) their potential impacts on members and seniors in our community.
6. To meet with MPs, MLAs and Civic Officials representing our community to:
 - a) inform them of the Association's concerns, advocacy positions and priorities.
 - b) inform them of the needs of our members and seniors, and
 - c) suggest how these priorities, concerns and needs can be addressed.
